Mad Max: Fury Road, John Seale
The Revenant, Emmanuel Lubezki
Sicario, Roger Deakins

Lachman inspired by female photographers
Richardson won for *JFK*, *The Aviator*, and *Hugo*Seale won for *The English Patient*Lubezki won for *Gravity* and *Birdman*Deakins, nominated 13 times has not won

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Not only did it crush the competition, only *Carol* got any other votes!

## Best Film Editing

Mad Max: Fury Road, Margaret Sixel
The Revenant, Stephen Mirrione
Spotlight, Tom McArdle
Star Wars, Episode VII, Maryann Brandon, etc.

Corwin was long associated with Oliver Stone Sixel is the director's longtime wife and coworker Mirrione is better-known for multi-story pieces

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Mad Max barely beat Revenant and Star Wars, even though its support elsewhere was pretty low.

## Best Production Design

The Danish Girl, Eve Stewart
Mad Max: Fury Road, Colin Gibson
The Martian, Arthur Max
The Revenant, Jack Fisk

Stockhausen won last year for *Grand Budapest*.

Stewart works often with Mike Leigh, Tom Hooper.

Gibson helped design the sets for *Babe*.

Max lost for *Gladiator* and *American Gangster*.

Fisk (aka Mr. Spacek) lost for *There Will Be Blood*.

# Best Supporting Actor

Christian Bale, *The Big Short*Tom Hardy, *The Revenant*Mark Ruffalo, *Spotlight*Mark Rylance, *Bridge of Spies*Sylvester Stallone, *Creed* 

Creed the only movie not up for Best Picture.

Bale is the only past winner, for The Fighter.

Hardy, Rylance first-time nominees.

Stallone won the Globe, Rylance the British Oscar.

## Best Supporting Actor

Christian Bale, *The Big Short*Tom Hardy, *The Revenant*Mark Ruffalo, *Spotlight*Mark Rylance, *Bridge of Spies*Sylvester Stallone, *Creed* 

Stallone held off significant challenges from Bale and Ruffalo in our balloting.

# Best Supporting Actress

Jennifer Jason Leigh, *The Hateful Eight*Rooney Mara, *Carol*Rachel McAdams, *Spotlight*Alicia Vikander, *The Danish Girl*Kate Winslet, *Steve Jobs* 

Spotlight the only Best Picture nominee in this race.

Leigh, McAdams, Vikander never nominated.

Mara, Vikander controversially categorized.

Vikander won the Screen Actors Guild award.

Winslet won Golden Globe and British Oscar.

## Best Supporting Actress

Jennifer Jason Leigh, *The Hateful Eight*Rooney Mara, *Carol*Rachel McAdams, *Spotlight*Alicia Vikander, *The Danish Girl*Kate Winslet, *Steve Jobs* 

Vikander barely edged out Mara and McAdams.

This was the only acting category where every nominee got at least one vote from our group.

### Best Actor

Bryan Cranston, *Trumbo*Matt Damon, *The Martian*Leonardo DiCaprio, *The Revenant*Michael Fassbender, *Steve Jobs*Eddie Redmayne, *The Danish Girl* 

Cranston the only first-time nominee—and is nominated for playing a real-life Oscar winner.

DiCaprio looking to win on his fifth acting nom.

### Best Actor

Bryan Cranston, *Trumbo*Matt Damon, *The Martian*Leonardo DiCaprio, *The Revenant*Michael Fassbender, *Steve Jobs*Eddie Redmayne, *The Danish Girl* 

Julianne Moore, who won on *her* fifth nomination last year, is very likely to present this to Leo, who got more than 3/4 of your votes.

#### Best Actress

Cate Blanchett, *Carol*Brie Larson, *Room*Jennifer Lawrence, *Joy*Charlotte Rampling, *45 Years*Saoirse Ronan, *Brooklyn* 

Though only two of these movies are up for Best Picture, almost every Hollywood journalist agrees that this acting lineup is the strongest of the four.

#### Best Actress

Cate Blanchett, *Carol*Brie Larson, *Room*Jennifer Lawrence, *Joy*Charlotte Rampling, *45 Years*Saoirse Ronan, *Brooklyn* 

Larson also trounced her competition, including runner-up Cate Blanchett.

### **Best Director**

Lenny Abrahamson, *Room*Alejandro González Iñárritu, *The Revenant*Tom McCarthy, *Spotlight*Adam McKay, *The Big Short*George Miller, *Mad Max: Fury Road* 

Only González Iñárritu has won in this category. Miller won his only Oscar for *Happy Feet*. McCarthy, McKay likely to win for Screenplay.

### **Best Director**

Lenny Abrahamson, *Room*Alejandro González Iñárritu, *The Revenant*Tom McCarthy, *Spotlight*Adam McKay, *The Big Short*George Miller, *Mad Max: Fury Road* 

If he wins, González Iñárritu will become the first back-to-back winner in this category since John Ford in 1940 and 1941 (for *Grapes of Wrath* and *How Green Was My Valley*).

### Best Documentary Feature

Amy (about Amy Winehouse)

Cartel Land (about the War on Drugs)

The Look of Silence (Indonesian genocide)

What Happened, Miss Simone? (aka, Nina)

Winter on Fire (Ukrainian uprising)

None of these directors has ever won the Oscar.

Amy and The Look of Silence earned most of the prizes from critics' groups.

The Big Short Bridge of Spies Brooklyn Mad Max: Fury Road The Martian The Revenant Room Spotlight

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A landslide winner, despite few Director votes.
